To the saints at Trinity Lutheran Church in Circleville,

Grace to you, and peace from God the Father, and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

As we live together in these days of uncertainty, caution, continuing change and doubt and fear, we can only wonder what is the next problem or challenge that will come into our life. Considering both our personal life and the life we share here at Trinity, every day I feel overwhelmed and numbed by the numbers coming from the media outlets and health officials. We have learned that trying to keep up with the covid requirements and restrictions isn't so much a physical challenge as it is an emotional and spiritual challenge.

I would remind you all, as we move forward together, that one of the major themes in the Bible, from the beginning to the end, is one of movement. Sometimes the movement is a spiritual shift, sometimes the movement is a physical move, often, the movement is both at the same time.

Let us remember, God calls Abraham and Sarah to pack up their belongings, leave family and friends behind, and move to a new land. The invitation to make that physical move also begins a lifelong spiritual relationship between Abraham, Sarah and God.

Let us remember the Good Samaritan; his movement was simply to cross the road and help the stranger. Yet, that journey of a few yards has become an eternal example of the depth of love we can feel and act upon for someone different than us.

Let us remember the call of the disciples; a simple invitation to 'follow me' from Jesus was the physical movement that lead those simple fishermen to an unexpected and unknown spiritual journey that would change the world. Let us remember the unnamed and unclean woman who stepped out of the crowd to simply touch the hem of Jesus' robe. In taking those few physical steps, she risked ridicule and punishment from her community, but at the same time, her actions were a spiritual leap that led to her healing, but also became a symbol of hope for countless others.

As I listen to Trinity's members, I hear voices and messages of frustration, hope, confusion, and fear. The presence of the Corona Virus in our lives is a real, and sometimes deadly, truth. Everyday is a challenge trying to keep up with the challenges the constant changes brings.

Let us remember that a life of faith is a spiritual journey from where we are, to where God call us to be. Let us remember that sometimes that spiritual journey also requires us to take a physical journey as well.

I hear voices saying they wished life would return to 'normal.' I am neither a great philosopher or great theologian, but my understanding of having a relationship with Jesus has shown me that life is never 'normal' after experiencing his forgiveness, grace, love, and mercy.

Let us remember that a life of faith is a spiritual journey from where we are, to where God calls us to be. Let us remember that sometimes that spiritual journey also requires us to take a physical journey as well.

I hear voices saying they are uncomfortable to be out and about without a vaccine. I fully understand and accept this position and I encourage everyone to continue to practice healthy procedures that protect themselves, but others as well. It would be foolish for us to adopt an "I don't need to follow covid precautions, God will protect me" attitude.

But the journey of faith is not always easy:

- Mary had to tell Joseph and her family she was pregnant.
- A little boy stepped up and shared his meager lunch helping Jesus to feed thousands.
- The women left the safety of the group to go to the tomb Easter morning, to face the Roman guards.
- Stephen declared his faith in Jesus, leading to his death by stoning.

The council will be meeting in these days to decide what should happen in our worship life in the changing covid conditions, but at the same time we will be discussing plans for our autumn ministry, mission and outreach programs.

We are a blessed and called people, and I encourage us all to fight fear and despair in these days, and follow the call of faith as we move forward together.

Because I know God has promised to be me with us always, it is my prayer for you all ---

May the peace of God, which surpasses all human understanding keep your hearts and minds on Christ Jesus.
